- **Antonio Enrique Gonzalez RODILES Fernandez**

Rodiles is a Cuban political activist who coordinates “Estado de Sats,” a forum created in July 2010 to encourage debate on social, cultural and political issues in Cuba. He is also the main organizer of the Citizen Demand for Another Cuba, an initiative calling for Cuba to ratify the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, as well as the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, of which Cuba is a signatory. Rodiles uses the internet extensively to foster discussion and promote and defend human rights.

- **Bektour Iskender**

Iskender is one of the founders of the Kloop Media Foundation in Kyrgyzstan, an organization that promotes freedom of speech by educating the next generation of journalists in Central Asia. He has been a driving force towards the success of the foundation and news website, not only as president of the foundation, but also as editor-in-chief for Kloop.kg and as the primary trainer in the journalism school.

- **Cheikh Séne**

Séne combines web activism with musical talent to foster political and humanitarian dialogue in Senegal, primarily through a project called Journal Rappé (“Rapped News”). Séne also participates in other forms of web activism such as Sunu2012 which used Twitter to monitor and report on the 2012 Senegalese presidential elections.

- **Ezgi Tuzun**

Tuzun is the co-founder and co-coordinator of the Turkish website ‘bobiler.org’, a platform for political satire. The site allows visitors, mainly youths, to publish humorous cartoons, drawings, photo-shopped photographs and video clips that express their political views.

- **Delta Lau Milayo Ndou**

Ndou, a Zimbabwean human rights activist, stands out for her ability to separate issues from political allegiances. As a journalist, blogger and social media influencer, she has given voice to controversial ideas and opinions that challenge oppression.
